In concrete terms, IP65 means that the housing is fully protected against the ingress of dust and is also resistant to water jets from any angle. A device with this protection class is therefore classified as

IP65 is designed to withstand low pressure water jets. IP67 is suitable for short immersions, while IP68 is the highest level, providing long-term immersion

Specifically, for the IP65 rating, dust protection has a rating of 6, out of the possible 6. That means devices with this rating have the highest possible level of
